"Like most artists, I think my work is the result of my collective visual influences. I grew up in the 1980's, immersed in 80's pop culture, video games, comic books and cartoon images. I believe that resulted in my tendencies towards bold colors, thick black outlines and iconic stylization. It's a visual vocabulary that is very familiar to me.

I also find it very difficult to return to a piece of artwork once I leave it, consequently most of my pieces are almost entirely completed in one session. Art, to me, is like a time capsule. It's what I was thinking and feeling at that moment.

The illustrative style gives me the ability to conceive and execute my work before my specific motivation changes or subsides. I agree that my work is rich in attitude. If a Monet landscape is the visual equivalent to a serene orchestral movement, my paintings are a loud, bouncy rhythm that makes some people stand up and dance and gives other people a headache. I enjoy the creative process and have a tremendous amount of fun when I'm working. I think that comes across in my paintings and drawings."
